Guest Presenter Heather Houk, Agriculture Program Coordinator, Pueblo Community College Southwest Workforce Development Workforce Resiliency Grant from CCCS <a href="https://cccs.edu/industry/workforce-resilience-program/">https://cccs.edu/industry/workforce-resilience-program/</a> Heather presented programs that PCCSW has available, including the Fire Science and Fire Academy programs with simulator, welding, drone operations, botany, GIS and other trades related to Natural Resources Management. She explained that many of the programs are free tuition and college credit can be gained. The board discussed needs for seasonal positions or individual placements in the future. It is too late to hire for the upcoming spring/summer season but by next season there could potentially be a workforce pipeline program. Other organizations that could benefit from a workforce program include local conservation districts, not-for-profit entities and local governments. The board discussed whether this falls into the Montelores Coalition's mission. They also discussed collaboration with the SW Education Collaborative. Further discussion will be needed to determine how to best support a local workforce in the outdoors.
